You who, undaunted by the moment's obstacles, invested in our vision of a world where everyone has a decent place to live and saw it bear fruit, time and again.

MEETING THE MOMENT

THEN + NOW

Our history and our future are linked by something solid: the community's need as our mandate. It means listening to understand where people are at and responding with intention, innovation, and action.

There is profound power in what we do at Habitat for Humanity — power to move us toward equity and housing justice. It's why we push the envelope. Why we rally our community. Why we challenge ourselves to do more and do it better.

See how far we've come and how far we'll go, together.

HOME BUILDING

In the Bay Area, the need for affordable, decent housing is ever present. Renting within one's means grows more exclusive each year, with fewer and fewer people getting a foothold on homeownership. Habitat has stepped up to the need by doing what we're best known for: home building.

THEN + NOW

We build not simply to create more units of housing. We build to create more homes that people can count on. Behind each door we hang, is someone who has achieved homeownership — who's left behind the uncertainty of rising rents, with a mortgage they can afford and stability they rely on. Endless opportunities grow from there. When Habitat builds — and when we build at scale — we build for generational impact that can truly change the story of housing in the Bay Area.

LARGE-SCALE GREEN DEVELOPMENTS

We recognized before most that we cannot ignore the spiraling climate crisis — and responded with our first solar panels and other green innovations in 2000. Today, we continue to push our whole-systems sustainability to more and more innovative places as the need becomes more pressing.

The 42 homes at Esperanza Place and the 10 at Sequoia Grove are just the latest two steps in our ongoing commitment. We've taken climatesmart efforts to Zero Net Energy and beyond, with elements like universal EV charging, battery backup storage, induction cooktops, heat-pump systems, and more.

HOME PRESERVATION

Over a decade ago, it became clear that breaking into the homeownership market wasn't the only hurdle for our neighbors. Across our service area, longtime homeowners faced mounting maintenance and repair needs well beyond their means.

We began to address the need with modest resources, and quickly pivoted to widen our scale and deepen our impact. As displacement looms ever larger for limited-income homeowners, Habitat has met the moment through hard work, partnerships, and thoughtful growth.

THEN + NOW

In 2012, we started with **\$75k** in repairs for **8 homeowners**.

partnerships with nonprofits & municipalities extend our reach Today, we continue to augment our repair services by growing into spaces of unmet need and underserved populations. Meanwhile, innovative collaborations let us target our impact to address specific problems of the moment in our communities.

Collaboration and data science **promote climate equity** as we connect low-income homeowners to electrical upgrades, powered by solar.

Lead abatement **makes homes and facilities safer** for residents and the community.

Older adults get critical home repairs and improvements as part of a holistic set of services that help them **age safely in place**.

By expanding our services, we are ensuring we reach homeowners who need us most, making a life-changing impact, and solving the housing crisis by keeping more homes safe, stable, and affordable.

HOUSING & FINANCIAL COUNSELING

It began with recognizing the need — financial preparation could help more people take on homeownership successfully. Now, we've grown through partnerships to reach specific populations with whom we could make a deep impact. The program has grown fifty-fold, meeting more people where they're at, with services tailored to them.

RESTORE

ReStore started as an idea: divert usable materials from landfills, offer home improvement at a discount, and funnel more support to Habitat's mission. It was an idea that grew into a movement — from one store into three — and expanding community benefits.

TOGETHER, WE MET THE MOMENT THAT CHANGED EVERYTHING.





It happened quietly last July. The final mortgage payment on Rosa and Manuel's beloved Habitat home in Alviso. It came with a sense of permanence, a fitting bookend to their first mortgage payment. "Ahh, this is mine," Rosa remembers thinking as she mailed that first check to the Habitat office in 1994. "This is ours. This is my daughters'."

More than a check, it continues to be a bright line in both their memories, one they believe drastically changed their family's path.



WHERE IT STARTED

A few years before that first mortgage payment, Rosa knew something was missing for her family and her community — more decent, stable housing that more people could afford.

Both Rosa and Manuel's families had been rooted in Alviso for decades — a small district north of San Jose, where community ties were strong but housing opportunity was slim. They lived five to a room, or in converted garages, to keep their three little girls housed.

So, Rosa advocated to bring Habitat for Humanity to Alviso — and Habitat answered the call. When they were selected to purchase one of the affordable new Habitat homes, it was the point where their deep-set values of hard work, family, education, and community took on new momentum.

That first mortgage payment signaled a sea change, a certainty that their "forever"

had begun. "I knew it," Rosa remembers.
"They're going to take me out of this
house feet first. That's the only way I'm
leaving. We love it here."

30 YEARS LATER

Now, a complete mortgage later, they have a life marked by memories and milestones. Graduations. Engagements. New, thriving careers. A pending retirement. Another generation of children filling the home with joy.

"It's because of Habitat that my daughters all went to college, I owe Habitat that," Rosa always insists. "There was no way they would have been the women they are if it hadn't been for Habitat... Good human beings, all three of them. They are just amazing women."

For Rosa, it began with home. "I am so, so grateful. Habitat made it easier for us to just survive in this valley. It was a tool for us. That's what we're doing. We're putting our tools to work."

ADRIANA, NELLIE, AND ANGELICA WERE YOUNG GIRLS WHEN THEIR PARENTS ADVOCATED FOR, BUILT, AND MOVED INTO THEIR HABITAT HOME.

While their experiences are unique, they share a sense of pride in their parents, a deep gratitude for the role a stable home had in their lives, and a desire for others to have that same experience.

ADRIANA

The youngest daughter, Adriana's path has taken her though USC, a Fulbright Scholarship in Guatemala, a Master's degree at NYU, and now into a career and her impending marriage. Her Habitat home, though, remains the anchor. "As an adult, being able to come home to that same house I grew up in — that's stability. It's security. It's dignity."

She has a huge sense of pride in the milestone of her parents' completing

their mortgage. "They have worked so hard for our family. My dad's family lived in migrant camps, and you look at the trajectory, where we're at now. When we look at the life we have today, we're all thriving, and it's thanks to them."

Adriana is quick to add, "I always, always have to attribute it to Habitat, too." She sees their home as the thing that altered the equation — the foundation that they built their future on.

"BECAUSE YOU DON'T UNDERSTAND WHAT HAVING A STABLE ROOF OVER YOUR HEAD DOES FOR YOU. Everything changed. There was more than a fresh pot of beans on the table now. There was education, there was health. Every aspect of our lives. I think sometimes it's hard for people to comprehend that, because we take for granted the four walls that embrace us every day. But that is everything, especially to a child."

It is because of her experience that she finds resonance in her work as a realtor. "I don't see it as just a transaction," Adriana says. "It should take as long as it needs to in order for a client to get what they're looking for, so that they can feel that same sense of pride and ownership over something so significant... It's personal for me. I will literally show someone 50 homes if it means it's going to be the right home for them. Because homeownership, to me, is so significant."


NELLIE

Rosa and Manuel's middle daughter, Nellie, was 10 when they moved into their Habitat home. "I remember seeing the weight come off of the shoulders of my parents," she says. "Things got progressively easier and happier for all of us. There was less stress. It's very special to go into your home and feel love and comfort." And for a child who remembered distinctly moving from one crowded space to another, the shift was profound.

"When we finally got our Habitat home," she says, "I felt that sense of security I didn't have before. It wasn't anything that I could really describe as a kid.

AS AN ADULT, I UNDERSTAND THAT THE FEELING WAS SAFETY."

What has come full circle for Nellie is that sense of connection the home brings — which now she sees in the eyes of her three young children, who absolutely love visits to their grandparents' home. Though Nellie and her husband own their own home, there's nothing like the home she grew up in. "I feel like my kids are feeling those feelings that I had. They feel safe, and they feel happy, and they feel excited about being there. I have it in my own home now, but I'm very appreciative of my Habitat home. Those feelings that you have as a kid, that security, it's priceless."

ANGELICA

Angelica, the oldest of Rosa and Manuel's girls, sees her parents' completed mortgage not as an ending, but another beginning — the start of a secure retirement. "That, for me, is what really matters," Angelica says. "My parents have a place to age. This is their forever home." Angelica and her sisters all remember the security their home offered in their youth - and how their parents projected it outward. Whether it was Rosa translating papers and helping with job applications, or Manuel tending a neighbor's garden and offering rides, never expecting payment, their parents were beacons in the community.

Angelica sees their parents as an example of hard work and community consciousness, and their home a foundation on which the girls, too, could build futures that embodied their values. "My sisters and I don't talk about it

much," Angelica says, "but I feel like we all don't want to know where we'd be if this home hadn't come to be our home."

For Angelica, those values are a passion for service and Habitat's mission, and she's living them out today. This year she is celebrating 10 years of working at Habitat for Humanity Greater San Francisco, where she serves as Vice President of Homeownership Services. "It's a way to pay it forward, to remember my own experience and have it be a connector to the families. I'M PROUD OF HOW I SHOW UP FOR THE MISSION."

For someone who understands firsthand what Habitat's work has meant to the five people in her family, Angelica takes pride in stewarding that opportunity for hundreds more.

MEETING THE MOMENT

While paying off a mortgage is a tremendous milestone — one that Habitat will see more and more of in the coming years — it's also not the end of the story. It's just another milestone to add to the collection of life's successes for families who've spent 30 years in stable, affordable Habitat homes.

The real impact is in all the milestones that make up those 30 years between the first mortgage check and the last. The impact of the home on each individual, the collection of opportunities met, and lives lived to the fullest. Lives unburdened by housing insecurity, financial stress, and having to choose surviving over thriving.

When we meet the moment, together, we transform what's possible for families and communities — and begin a new chapter of powerful change.
